PROJECT RULES:

Students are encouraged to create a project that would ignite a positive conversation surrounding mental health issues. All high school students who attend a Dunn County school (including virtual and home school students) are eligible to participate. Possible projects include, but are not limited to: stories, videos, posters, paintings, skits, speeches, sculptures, origami, poems or songs.

Projects must be of original designs and may not contain artwork that is copyrighted. The winner's project will be mass distributed to the Dunn County schools and other media sources courtesy of funding from the Dunn County Partnership for Youth. The winner's project may not be mass distributed due to inappropriate or indecent material (this will be determined by the judges).

Submitted projects may be publicly displayed to help promote mental health awareness in Dunn County. One finalist from Dunn County (Boyceville, Colfax, Elk Mound, and Menomonie) will be selected in May of 2018. The finalist will receive a \$500 award.
